Xyza Cruz Bacani (b. 1987, the Philippines) is an award-winning interdisciplinary artist and writer based in New York. Her experience as a secondgeneration domestic worker in Hong Kong informs her practice and engagement in less visible, erased, and underreported world events. Her works explore migration, transnational identity, climate change, and labor.

Bacani received her M.A. in Arts Politics at New York University in 2022 despite lacking an undergraduate degree. She has been recognized as one of Asia Society's Asia 21 Young Leaders, Artpil's 30 Under 30 Women Photographers, Forbes's 30 Under 30 Asia, and BBC's 100 Women of the World. Her artistic accomplishments are documented by the Philippines House of Representatives under 'House Resolution No. 1969'. She received multiple grants from the WMA Commission, the Open Society Moving Walls Foundation, and the Pulitzer Center, and was one of the Magnum Foundation Photography and Social Justice Fellows. She is also the author of We Are *Like Air*.

Bacani's work is in the permanent collections of the Museum of Contemporary Photography, Chicago; Kadist Collection, Paris & San Francisco; Foreign Correspondents Club, Hong Kong; Asian Art Museum, San Francisco; New York University, Abu Dhabi; and numerous private collections worldwide.

Born in the UK in 1963, **Nick Archer** studied at the Royal Academy Schools in London. He received several awards, including the Hunting Art Prize, the BP Portrait Award at the National Portrait Gallery (London), and the Figure Painting Award at the Discerning Eye Award.

He has exhibited extensively in the UK and Europe. His paintings were presented in several international art fairs in the US and Japan and were featured in museum exhibitions including the National Portrait Gallery, London and the Wandsworth Museum, London. His works are included in several international private, corporate and public collections, including the Satellite collection of the Hermitage Museum (Moscow), the Historic Royal Palaces at the Tower of London, and the Al-Sabah Family Collection (Kuwait). He lives and works in Rye, East Sussex.





Jenny Pockley (b. 1972, UK) is known for her evolving creative journey. Initially recognized for her cityscape paintings in diffused or minimal light, Pockley has recently turned her focus to natural landscapes such as mountains, sea, and sky. Her technique involves using thin layers of oil paint, which emanate a subtle luminosity and evoke elements of color-field abstraction.

Pockley completed her post-graduate diploma at the Royal Academy Schools in London in 1997 after obtaining a BA(Hons) Fine Arts Degree from the Kent Institute of Art & Design in Canterbury. She has exhibited her work in London and internationally, including cities like Bath, Paris, New York, San Francisco, Dallas, Seattle, Shanghai, and Toronto. Pockley has received commissions from both private and corporate clients, including the Waldorf Astoria Group and Tiffany's. She lives and works in Rye, East Sussex.






Born in 1964 in Thessaloniki, Greece, **Vangelis Pliarides** graduated from the Aristotle University, School of Fine Arts in Thessaloniki in 1989. He finished his studies in London at the Royal College of Art by obtaining a Post Experience Diploma (PED) in Painting (1992) and a Master of Fine Arts in Painting (1994).

Received awards and fellowships from the British Council, the Fulbright Foundation and the RTZ plc, his artworks are included in various public collections such as Astra Zeneca (Sweden), Alfa Laval (Sweden), Scania (Sweden), Södertälje Konsthall (Sweden), Union of Swedish Artists (Sweden), Royal College of Art (UK), British Council (UK), Fulbright Foundation in Greece, Frissiras Museum (Greece), Foundation Sana-Huja (Spain), and Musée d'art moderne et contemporain (MAMCO) (Switzerland). He is currently a Professor of Painting at Aristotle University, School of Fine Arts. He lives and works in Thessaloniki and London.







Born in 1986 in Inner Mongolia, China, **Wei Xiaoguang** gained a BFA from the Central Academy of Fine Art (CAFA) in Beijing in 2010 and an MFA from Hunter College in New York in 2014. Overcoming the distinction between representation and abstraction, Wei Xiaoguang's work is deeply embedded in the post "Death of Painting" period. By carefully modulating the effects of light, textures, and surfaces, his paintings effectively combine multiple visual languages and artistic traditions. He has exhibited and performed at Central Academy of Fine Arts (CAFA) Art Museum in Beijing and lectured at Guangzhou Academy of Fine Arts and the Institute of Management of Art and Design of the Central Academy of Fine Arts (CAFA) in Shanghai. He has exhibited with Chambers Fine Art in New York and Galleries Urs Miele in Beijing and participated in the fairs in New York, Shanghai, and Singapore. He lives and works in Beijing.


FILMS LYNN LOO & GUY SHERWIN

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GUY SHERWIN

Guy Sherwin is a London-based filmmaker known for his groundbreaking work in avant-garde cinema.

Sherwin studied painting at Chelsea School of Art in the late 1960s before becoming involved with the radical film practice of the London Film-Makers' Co-operative (now LUX) where he taught printing and processing during the mid-'70s. His films investigate fundamental qualities of cinema such as light, time and space, and often use serial forms or live elements to extend its possibilities. The unique, elusive qualities of analogue film are explored through experiments with sound, image and film in gallery exhibitions and live performance.

His films are in the collections of the Tate Gallery, Cinémathèque Française, BFI London, British Council, National Library of Australia, LightCone Paris, Canyon Cinema San Francisco and the British Artists' Film & Video Study Collection. EYE Institute Amsterdam holds many of his 16mm film archive masters.

LYNN LOO

Lynn Loo is originally from Singapore and is currently based in London. Loo made a transition from a music background to filmmaking in 1997. She studied film and video at The School of the Art Institute of Chicago and film archiving at the University of East Anglia.

A way to describe her films is that they are compositions of images and sound that suggest narratives or convey an event without text or words. In 2004, She was introduced to expanded cinema film works in the UK, specifically from the 70s. This has broadened her exploration of filmmaking to an investigation of celluloid and presenting works in a performance element with multiple projectors.

Since 2005, She has been collaborating with Sherwin in numerous film performances and projects. Her films have been included in numerous international festivals and galleries. Some of her works are in the collection of the Asian Film Archive in Singapore and recently in He Xiangning Art Museum in China.
